**Reports of Officers, Committees and Others:**

**Richard Pockat, Non-Coach Zone Director**

Richard reported on his first year in office. He's met with the General Chairs of the LSCs through conference calls and at the General Chairs' Workshop in Omaha. **Duffy Dillon, Coach Zone Director**

Duffy thanked the Delegates for the opportunity to serve the Southern Zone for the past four years. Clark Hammond, SE, grew up swimming in Ft. Lauderdale. He has a great appreciation for what swimming has brought him. When his daughter started swimming, he became an Official. He has been an Official for 17 years. He is on the Southeastern Officials Committee. He has officiated at all levels of meets. He does Officials Evaluations. He took on this position a few years ago. A motion was made to completely eliminate the rotation process. M/S/P

A site presentation was made by North Carolina, by Jonathan Watson, General Chair, NC. The Raleigh pool is a new indoor pool. There are plenty of hotels in the area. The airport is about 10 miles away from the pool. The Open Water competition would be at Falls Lake, about 15 miles from the pool complex, north of Raleigh. Discussion of the venue ensued.

A site presentation was made by the Orlando YMCA. Orlando has hosted many National meets and Junior National meets, and is very capable of hosting the Zone Championships. Hotels are plentiful within one mile of the pool. Orlando is the hospitality capital of the United

States. The pool is a ten-minute drive from the airport. The Open Water competition would be held at Sea World. Sea World would be opened up to all of the open water swimmers and the rest of the athletes. Discussion of the venue ensued.

A site presentation was made by Palo Alto, San Antonio, by Denny Ryther, ST. Palo Alto has hosted the Zone Championships in the past. A new hotel is being built across the street. Three more hotels are within five minutes of the pool. The Open Water competition would be at Boerne Lake.
